

More than 100 marijuana plants seized

Detectives seized 101 marijuana plants from a rural Hancock County residence Thursday, the Hancock County METRICH drug unit reported Friday.

After obtaining a search warrant, detectives went to the residence at 3456 Ohio 12, north of Rawson. They noticed a person planting marijuana plants in a corn field behind the residence, according to the drug unit.

Detectives searched the residence and located a "soil-based marijuana grow operation inside," the drug unit said.

They seized 101 marijuana plants, "numerous" items of drug paraphernalia and criminal tools, according to the unit.

Ryan Pina, 25, was arrested on two outstanding warrants from Findlay Municipal Court and Hancock County Juvenile Court, the drug unit said.

Criminal charges of cultivating marijuana, possession of drug paraphernalia, and possession of criminal tools are pending, according to the drug unit.
