

Eight men indicted after drug probe

Eight Upper Sandusky residents have been indicted on felony charges for allegedly selling cocaine, pain pills and marijuana in Wyandot County.

Wyandot County Sheriff Michael Hetzel said Monday all eight suspects were arrested Saturday following a several-month investigation into illegal drug activity in Sycamore, Carey, Upper Sandusky and Nevada.

Those arrested include:

- Shannon L. Drummond, 44, for two counts of aggravated trafficking in drugs, both third-degree felonies.
- Joshua L. Smith, 21, for two counts of aggravated trafficking in drugs. One is a third-degree felony and one is a fourth-degree felony.
- Gretchen E. Pneuman, 19, for two counts of aggravated trafficking in drugs. One is a third-degree felony and one is a fourth-degree felony.
- Rebekka J. Reed, 25, of Upper Sandusky, for three counts of aggravated trafficking in drugs. One is a third-degree felony and two are fourth-degree felonies. Two of the counts allege Reed sold drugs near a juvenile.
- Cody D. Raisor, 19, for aggravated trafficking in drugs, a fourth-degree felony, and trafficking in cocaine, a fifth-degree felony.
- Seth M. Vent, 22, for trafficking in drugs and marijuana, both fifth-degree felonies.
- Richard A. Goble, 23, for two counts of trafficking in marijuana, both fifth-degree felonies.
- Colin C. Pneuman, 22, for two counts of trafficking in cocaine, both fifth-degree felonies.
