

Felony charges pending after Friday drug bust

An investigation into trafficking of heroin and cocaine from Detroit has lead to two arrests.

Curtis Hall, 35, of Detroit, and Reese Webster, 41, 154 N. Mulberry St., were arrested and charged Friday with drug trafficking, a fifth-degree felony; possession of heroin, a fourth-degree felony; possession of cocaine, a third-degree felony; and possession of Oxycotin, a first-degree felony.

The METRICH Enforcement Unit and Mansfield Police Department obtained search warrants to enter Webster's residence along with room 143 of Comfort Inn North, 500 N. Trimble Road.

Detectives seized \$4,500 in cash, a 2003 Ford F-150 pickup, drugs with an estimated street value of over \$4,000 including 30 bindles of heroin, over 30 grams of cocaine and 52 Oxycotin 80 milligram pills along with drug paraphernalia. A bindle is a small packet, usually under one gram.

Lt. Ken Coontz of the METRICH Enforcement Unit said that additional charges are pending on Hall and Webster as the investigation continues.
