

Most Wanted: 3 still sought after METRICH operation

Three stragglers from a recent METRICH Enforcement Unit operation remain at large.

The Richland County division of the Northern Ohio Violent Fugitive Task Force tracked down 14 of 17 suspects, the culmination of an investigation that took several months, on Wednesday.

"We're happy with the arrests of these subjects, we have a short-term impact on the Richland County community," METRICH Commander Lt. Ken Coontz said.

Coontz credited the task force.

"They did an outstanding job," he said.

Still on the loose are Chantilly Murnahan, 30; Timothy A. Johnson, 37; and Patrick Reynolds, 22.

Murnahan is wanted on two counts of trafficking in drugs. She is 5 feet, 4 inches and weighs 105 pounds. Murnahan has blonde hair and blue eyes.

Johnson and Reynolds also are wanted on two charges of trafficking in drugs. Johnson is 5 feet, 10 inches and 185 pounds with black hair and brown eyes. Reynolds is 6 feet and 175 pounds. He has brown hair and brown eyes.

"We would encourage them to turn themselves in; however, if not, we will pursue them until they are caught," Lt. Allen Vandayburg said.

Coontz said the trio has no connections to each other.
