Drug raid turns up meth in Tiffin

METRICH Enforcement unit executed a search warrant Sunday at 38 Main St. in Tiffin with the help of Tiffin Police Department, Fostoria Police Department and the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation Clandestine Lab Unit

The warrant was executed at the residence of Aaron D. Gannon, 36 years old.

The Tiffin SRT, Team along with officers from Fostoria Police Department SWAT team, were used to execute the warrant on the residence, according to a press release from the METRICH unit. The multi-team investigation turned up suspected methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia and US currency at the residence, the release states.

Gannon is facing charges of domestic violence, unlawful restraint, possession of methamphetamine and possession of drug paraphernalia stemming from the search warrant, according to the release. Gannon is facing additional charged for trafficking methamphetamine and heroin upon the conclusion of the entire investigation and lab analysis results, it states.

"The task force was receiving a lot of drug intelligence on that specific residence reporting suspected drug activity for some time," Interim Chief Jason Windsor of the Tiffin Police Department said. "We have been seeing an increase in methamphetamine related calls throughout the entire county and area law enforcement has made it a priority to address those citizen complaints. This operation was successful due to help from the community and teamwork between all Seneca County law enforcement agencies."

The search warrant was signed by Judge Jay Meyer of Seneca County Commons Pleas Court.
