

Fostoria man arrested after drug search

A man was arrested Wednesday as the Seneca County Drug Task Force-METRICH Enforcement Unit executed a drug-related search warrant at his Columbus Avenue residence.

A news release from METRICH said David Seth Kammeyer, 42, of Fostoria, was booked into the Seneca County Jail Wednesday pending court proceedings. He was arrested on an active warrant from Seneca County for failure to appear.



Additional charges of trafficking methamphetamine, possession of crack cocaine, possession of cocaine, illegal possession of a firearm and possession of criminal tools are pending on Kammeyer upon conclusion of the entire investigation, according to the news release.

Officers from Fostoria and the Tiffin Police Department, as well as a Fostoria canine unit, assisted METRICH in executing the warrant, signed by Seneca County Common Pleas Judge Damon Alt, the news release said.

"We had been receiving a large number of complaints of suspected drug activity going on at the residence, which opened the 'ongoing' investigation," Fostoria Police Chief Gabe Wedge said. "The Fostoria Police (Division), along with the task force, will continue our efforts on attempting to locate and 'shut down' suspected locations which abuse and traffic these illicit drugs throughout our community."
