

Games parlor raided

Lucky Dragon Internet Cafe was raided by local law enforcement agencies Monday afternoon.

The Hancock County METRICH Drug Task Force, Findlay Police Department, Hancock County Sheriff's Office, Ohio Investigative Unit and city of Findlay Street Department executed a search warrant at the cafe about 1:50 p.m. The search warrant stemmed from an ongoing investigation into numerous citizen complaints about the 1107 Tiffin Ave. business, according to a release from METRICH Drug Enforcement Unit.

Complaints included the use and sale of illegal narcotics by patrons within the business, a survived overdose and illegal cash payouts via gaming machines operated inside the cafe.

Seized from the business were 60 electronic video gaming devices, four large tabletop gaming devices, a "Queen of Hearts" gaming board with payouts and a total of \$53,047 cash from gaming devices, payout machines and business profits.

The owner of the Lucky Dragon Internet Cafe could face charges of gambling and operating a gambling house pending the outcome of the investigation.
